Session A: A Systematic Way to Improve Your Medicare Quality Measures by Using Data Analytics

Many hospitals have failed to make significant progress in improving their Medicare Quality Measures. Because of a lack of cohesion between clinical and financial leadership, hospitals have often failed to set achievable goals and instead have spent vast resources, whether through staffing or systems, without attaining meaningful results. New revenue models for health systems call for new compensation models for physicians—models that provide incentives for quality as well as productivity.
